ON THIS DATE

January 5, 1940: FCC hears 1st transmission of FM radio with clear, static-free signal in a long-distance relay network, via five stations in five States. FM broadcasting is a broadcasting technology pioneered by Edwin Howard Armstrong which uses frequency modulation (FM) to provide high-fidelity sound over broadcast radio. For the first time, clear radio reports could be transmitted hundreds of miles with no degradation of signal or clarity loss to component noise.
